#### 1. Introduction

The Findhorn, Nairn and Lossie Fisheries Trust was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2008. Its Charity status was granted on the 18<sup>th</sup> December 2008. Since this date the Trust has been successfully pursuing its charitable objectives. The name was changed to Findhorn, Nairn & Lossie Rivers Trust Ltd on 8th December 2020 and the name changed again on 12th April 2021 to Findhorn, Nairn & Lossie Rivers Trust.

#### 2. Governance and Management

Membership of the Trust consists of representatives of the Findhorn, Nairn and Lossie District Salmon Fishery Boards (DSFB), the local councils, the local angling associations, SNH, SEPA, and those with an interest in fisheries and river management. The Trust's Board meets three times per year, in addition to the AGM.

- (a)Governing documents: Memorandum of Association, Articles of Association.

  Company limited by guarantee
- (b)Appointment of Directors: The Findhorn DSFB is entitled to nominate two Directors to the Board. The Nairn DSFB, Lossie DSFB, the Forres and Nairn Angling Associations and the Elgin and District Angling Association are each entitled to nominate one Director to the Board. The membership is entitled to nominate six Directors to the Board. At each AGM, one-third of the Directors must retire by rotation. The Directors to retire by rotation shall be those who have been longest in office since their last appointment. As between those Directors who became or were appointed on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot.
- (c)Induction and training of Directors: Upon election or appointment, new Directors must sign a statement that they have received the Articles and Memorandum of Association. The Articles and Memorandum detail their roles, responsibilities and legal obligations. Directors will already have expertise in fisheries and/or river management.
- (d)Organisational and decision-making structure: The Board makes policy decisions and any decision involving a substantial cost. Board members and Ordinary members may vote at AGMs. Associate Members may attend AGMs but are not entitled to vote. The Articles of Association lay out clear procedures for Members to declare an interest in a particular topic, in which case they are not entitled to vote on it. Day-to-day operating decisions are made by the Director, Administrator and Chairman.
- (e) and (f) Wider network and related parties: The Trust is a member of Fisheries Management Scotland, the representitive body for Scotland's network of District Salmon Fishery Boards and Rivers and Fisheries Trusts. FMS works very closely with the Scottish Government. The Trust continues to work in very close co-ordination with the Findhorn and Lossie DSFB. Indeed the Chairman, Director and Administrator of the Trust attend both DSFB meetings. The director provides scientific advice and the Administrator provides administrative support to the DFBs. There is an annual Joint Action Group meeting chaired by the Trust. Chairs of the DSFBs attend that meeting to decide future policies and actions on the rivers.
- (g)The Charity has reviewed its financial risks, security risks at the office and health and safety risks on the rivers and has taken the necessary precautions, including taking out an appropriate insurance policy.

#### 3. Objective and Activities

These are as follows:

#### a)The Trust's objectives are:

To conserve and restore all species of native freshwater fish and improve their habitats, and To advance the education and understanding of the river environment and river catchment management. The Trust thus has a broad remit and works in close co-ordination with both DSFBs and with the angling associations on the threee rivers, local councils, SEPA and SNH. The Trust undertakes and commissions research on the state of the river and the fish, co-ordinates projects for the improvement of the river such as obstacle removal, supports and co-ordinates water bailiff efforts, supports and co-ordinates predator control measures and the control of INNS.

#### b)Main objectives for the Year

Many of the intended projects and activities of the FNLRT were suspended or cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic. However FNLRT staff continued to work from home or in the field as usual whilst complying with Covid restrictions. National Electrofishing Project Scotland (NEPS) juvenile fish surveys of the Findhorn and Lossie were cancelled. The Atlantic Salmon Trust's smolt tagging project on the Findhorn was postponed. School sessions were suspended.

The FNLFT voted to change its name to reflect the widening role of the charity; which was approved by OSCR. Updating Management Plans for the Findhorn & Lossie for 2021-2016.

Project work on the control of Invasive Non-Native species (INNS) of plants and animals.

INNS on the Lossie was treated with SCLF funding and a Seasonal Project Officer appointed by the SISI project.

Habitat and juvenile fish surveys were undertaken for the development of the A96 road development.

Monitoring of wind farms, flood alleviation schemes and road upgrades continued.

Managing of the river bailiffing team under the guidance of the Director continued.

#### c) Strategy for achieving these objectives:

Supervise and co-ordinate the INNS control programme, liaising with riparian owners, contractors volunteers and members of the local community. Seek additional funding to expand the project. Conduct monitoring activities, both routine and for specific developments, to assess changes in fish populations in partnership with the DSFBs.

Participate in the Moray Firth Predator Management Group undertaking regular counts and control measures. Hold regular meetings or communications with DSFBs, bailiffs, SEPA, SNH and other stakeholders.

#### d) Details of significant activities:

Changing the name of the charity to the FNLRT with all relevant organisations and updating the website.

Updating the Management Plans for the Findhorn & Lossie to focus the work of the Trust on catchment wide initiatives: Climate amelioration, habitat improvements, in addition to fish conservation.

The Trust gained additional funding and staff through the Scottish Invasive Species Initiative (SISI), employing a Seasonal Project Officer to control invasive plants and mink.

Funding from EB Scotland (SLCF) & Crown Estate was obtained to expand control of INNS plants along the Lossie. The FNLFT was employed to undertake habitat and juvenile fish surveys to inform the development of river crossings for the A96 Dualling Project.

The Director worked in partnership with the DSFBs to respond to development consultations and monitoring of Windfarm and other developments continued.

Collection and analysis of rod catch data, scale samples and other fishery data continued.

- e) The charity does not offer grants.
- f) The charity does not make investments.
- g) A number of volunteers assisted the Trust with INNS and mink control and there has been a significant time commitment from the Chairman and other Directors.

#### 4. Achievements and Performance

The Trust's achievements and performance may be summarised as follows:

- a) The Trust is now working in full co-operation with both District Salmon Fishery Boards. The Trust's Director manages the River bailiffs and the Administrator is also administrator to both DSFBs.
- b) Control of INNS and mink continues on all three rivers and predator management strategies are now functioning more effectively.
- c) The Trust provides scientific advice to the DSFBs and is consulted on major developments such as windfarms, Flood alleviation schemes and infrastructure improvements.
- d) Fundraising activities: The Trust raised £4727 in donations.
- e) Fundraising activities: The Trust continues to operate an angler contribution scheme.
- f) No material investments are held.
- g) Factors relevant to achievement of objectives: Both DSFBs and the FNLFT continue to work effectively together.

#### 5. Financial Review

Review of financial position:

- a) The Trust produced a small deficit of £61 this year.
- b) Any funds materially in deficit: none
- c) Principle funding sources
  - i. Contributions from the Findhorn DSFB and the Lossie DSFB £25,300 (2020 £25,300)
  - ii. Grants and project income £106,813 (2020 £108,500)
  - iii.Anglers' donations £4,727 (2020 £7,127)
  - iv. How expenditure during the year has supported the key objectives of the charity: As seen above, the key objectives of the Trust are to conserve and restore all species of native freshwater fish and improve their habitats, and to advance the education and understanding of the river environment and river catchment management.
  - All Costs of Generating Funds were used to support, administer and co-ordinate these activities.
- d) Material investments: none

#### 6. Plans for Future Periods

Fisheries Management Plans for the rivers 2021-26 approved by FNLRT & DSFBs to inform the Trust's choice of projects for future years. Projects to reduce the effects of climate change will be prioritised. Control of non-native species and predators will continue and funding sought to continue these projects. Barrier removal in the River Lossie catchment will be a long term objective. Funding opportunities will continue to be identified.

#### 7. Funds Held as Custodian Trustee

The Trust holds monies on behalf of the Moray Firth Predator Management Group. This group was formed in Spring 2010 to investigate and manage the interactions between piscivorous birds and salmonids. To date, the group has had no additional income and has incurred no expenses. Thus there is no need for arrangements for segregating funds. When the Group becomes more active, the Trust plans to devise such arrangements.

#### 8. Conclusion

The Trust continues to progress its charitable objectives, while producing a small deficit. The Director continues to carry out a very broad range of work in the catchment areas of the three rivers.

#### 1 GENERAL INFORMATION

#### 2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

**Basis of accounting**

Income and expenditure
